MAIN STREET WORKS, GRENFELL

Central Tablelands Water (CTW) welcomed the recent opportunity to work with Weddin Shire Council on their upgrade project for Main Street Grenfell. CTW has its water reticulation mains running across Main Street at various locations, however the water main crossing the southern end of Main Street could not be isolated without disabling the fire services protecting the businesses and properties along the street. By working in collaboration with Weddin Shire Council's project team, CTW was provided safe access to the western side of Main Street to install a stop valve, which enabled all fire hydrants to remain in service whilst allowing the civil component of road works to continue unabated. Once again, in collaboration with Weddin Shire Council's project team, it was further suggested that CTW take the opportunity to replace the section of piping that crossed Main Street whilst a road closure was in place, thus alleviating the need for CTW to undertake this work later, avoiding further disruptions. CTW was able to mobilise staff from both the Blayney and Canowindra depots to ensure these works were completed without causing undue influence to the overall project. CTW's operational staff and the Weddin Shire Council project team embraced the joint approach that led to the success of the works undertaken in Grenfell.



RETICULATION RENEWAL PROJECT - MILTHORPE

Millthorpe residents would have noticed that the replacement of CTW's reticulation water mains, which were originally laid in 1956, has commenced. Stage 1a of this replacement program incorporates the western end of Pilcher Street, northern end of Hawke Street and the western end of Crowson Street. Stage 1b, incorporating both Unwin Street and Stabback Street, will commence at the completion of Stage 1a. CTW will progress the replacement of all Millthorpe's original water mains throughout this, and the following financial year.



CENTRAL TABLELANDS WATER (CTW) HYDRANTS

CTW advises that the use of portable standpipes in CTW's hydrants is strictly prohibited other than for the exclusive use of fire brigade services (for fire-fighting purposes). Unauthorised access to CTW's hydrants is subject to prosecution. CTW actively and vigorously monitors unauthorised use of water mains in its service supply area. ACCESS TO METERS

Consumers are respectfully reminded that they are required to permit access to water meters to allow water usage to be accurately recorded.

With your meter, please remember:

- Don't fence them in
- Don't hide them away
- Keep dogs under control
- Keep gardens and foliage trimmed

Customers must allow safe access to the metering point that is the property of Council. If access to the water meter is restricted, Council will issue an estimated account. Please call Council on 63917200 if you have any questions regarding your water meter access obligations.
